LIVE BATS ON DISPLAY AT NATURE CENTER NOV. 19

WALES TOWNSHIP — Experts from the Organization for Bat Conservation (www.batconservation.org) will take guests into the amazing world of bats during a visit to the Pine River Nature Center from 6-7 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 19.

As part of the Biodiversity Live presentation, participants can see a large fruit bat, sugar glider and bearded dragon. The program will also include a discussion of the balance of natural ecosystems, how humans are impacting biodiversity and simple actions that can be taken to protect wildlife from extinction.

The program is being made possible through a grant from Critter Catchers, Inc., a company that provides humane bat removal for Michigan residents and is partnered with the Organization for Bat Conservation. For more information, go to www.crittercatchersinc.com.
